

## Step 7: Summary and wrap up

Facilitator: If more than one group has been involved in problem mapping, have each group share their maps.

Ask for responses to the following from the large group:

- Ask the group to identify commonalities between the maps, questions and rankings.
- Determine if there are any areas where the large group can identify as a priority to address. Also determine if there are any direct actions, need for more information or need for more resources to address any priorities. (Record)
- Ask each person to complete an evaluation before they leave. Use Problem Mapping Participant Evaluation Form.
- Announce next steps. Information from problem mapping should be used to inform community plans (along with results of the Service Array Assessment, Community Context, Indicator data, etc.)
- Documentation: a) Copy the work of the problem mapping sessions and transfer it to the Problem Map format (template) as a record for the community. b) Provide a copy of the unduplicated questions generated by the group (template). c) Finally, enter the information on which consensus has been reached on the summary of priorities for community context (template). d) Compile the evaluations.
